Town Council

Bourbon's governmental body consists of a three-member council each of whom are elected at-large to serve a four-year term. The terms are staggered with two members elected in odd years and one elected in even years. At the first meeting in January of each year, the council elects one council member as president. This person serves as the chairperson for the council, setting agendas and leading meetings.

They also are responsible for appointing members to the Plan Commission, Board of Zoning Appeals, Redevelopment Commission. The elected and appointed officials are responsible for adopting ordinances and resolutions for Bourbon.

Water Deposit

To set up water utilities, please come to the Bourbon Clerk Treasurer's Office at 104 E Park Avenue or call the office at 574.342.4755. There is a \$80 deposit for the water utility.

Utility Bills

Bills for water, sewer, storm water, hydrant fees, and trash are sent out on the 10th of the month and are due the 25th. Payments may be made in person at town hall during office hours, placed in the secure drop box to the left of the office door anytime, or mailed in. Payments also are accepted via online credit card payment through govpaynow.com which is linked on the Town of Bourbon website.

Residential Trash and Recycling

Trash pickup and recycling for single family homes is provided by contract with Borden Waste Services. Residents are provided trash and recycling bins by Borden. Trash collection takes place every Friday; recycling is every other Friday. In the event of a major holiday, trash pickup will be on Saturday. Please place your trash and recycling totes at the curb no later than 5 a.m. The totes should be at least five (5) feet apart with the handles facing toward your residence. Place all trash inside the container. Large trash pickup is the last Friday of the month. Please remove totes from the curb within 24 hours of collection. If questions or concerns arise, contact Borden Waste direct at 574-293-5001. Please see the Town website for pick up calendars.

Golf Carts

Golf carts, as a form of transportation, are allowed on Bourbon streets provided the vehicles have the proper registration. Registrations may be obtained at Town Hall and are good for the calendar year. The registration fee is \$20.

Utility Vehicles

UTVs are allowed on Bourbon streets but must be registered with the Bureau of Motor Vehicles first and then the town. The registration fee is \$20.

Parks and Recreation

The town operates two parks. Bourbon Community Park is located on E. Sunset St and Westwood Park is located on W. Liberty St, the park is open from dawn until 10 p.m. and has a basketball court, pickleball, playgrounds, pavilions, cornhole boards & a splash pad and Amphitheater. Public Library

Matchett Event Center

The Bourbon Fire Department is a volunteer service. Located on N. Main St, the fire department serves Bourbon & Bourbon Township. If the department is called out, the siren will go off. Not to be confused with the tornado siren, which will stay at one level for three minutes, the fire siren pitch will go up and down five times before stopping. When it does go off, please be aware of fire fighters trying to get to the station quickly from all areas of town.

Utilities Department

This department designs, builds and maintains key town infrastructure including roads and alleys, traffic signs, water treatment and distribution, sewer collection and treatment, storm drains and town facilities.

Brush and Leaf Collection – The street crew collects brush and branches placed at the curb (please do not place it in in the street). In April/May and again in November, ending mid-December, the crew will collect leaves raked to the curb. Please do not mix branches with leaves as it will clog the leaf vacuum. Grass clippings and other yard waste need to be placed in a dumpable container not to exceed a weight of 50 lbs.

Christmas Trees – The street crew will pick up Christmas trees placed at the curb following the holiday season. Please be sure the tree is cleared of all decorations.

Building Department

Before you build, tear down, add or renovate a structure in town, please contact Chuck DeWitt, building commission for the Town of Bourbon and the Bourbon Zoning Area (jurisdictional area up to two (2) miles from town limits) for the current ordinance and building regulations or regarding planning and zoning concerns. Residents and registered contractors can apply for building permits for the Bourbon zoning jurisdiction online at https://permits.schneidercorp.com or by contacting the Marshall County Building Commissioner.
